CIRCULAR SAWS - HANDHELD

This TBT must not be uses as a substitute for formal training in the use of handheld circular saws. It should serve only as a reminder of training previously received. In appropriate circumstances, the equipment being discussed should be demonstrated.

- 1. Handheld circular saws can only be operated by persons trained and authorised to do so.
- 2. Ensure there is no loose clothing, and long hair tied back, which could get caught up in the saw.
- 3. Before use, ensure:
 - a. The machine and plug are compatible with the supply
 - b. Leads, plug and switch are undamaged
 - c. The correct type of blade is fitted for the work to be done
 - d. The blade is sharp and in good condition
 - e. The blade is effectively guarded, above and below the shoe plate
 - f. The spring-loaded bottom guard functions correctly
 - g. The blade is securely fitted to rotate in the correct direction
 - h. The blade is adjusted to the correct depth and angle, with teeth projecting just through the underneath of the material
- 4. Ensure that material to be cut is properly supported.
- 5. Use fence or straight edge as a guide.
- 6. Ensure that clamps do not impede movement of the saw.
- 7. Ensure there is sufficient length of cable. N/A if battery powered.

- 8. Take up the correct stance behind and in line with the saw.
- 9. Ensure the working area is free of obstructions.
- 10. Keep fingers well away from the saw blade.
- 11. Report any defect in the equipment or the system of work and stop working immediately.
